Lead Screening:

Lead poisoning is harmful and can cause problems with behavior, learning, and growth which is why it is important to be screened! The lead blood test can be done at the lab in the **main hospital, which is located on the first floor**. The **hours are 7:30am-4:30pm**. See the pictures below for common sources of lead.

GET LEAD OUT OF YOUR HOME

- Clean up loose paint chips
- Wash floors & windowsills
- Eat foods high in iron and calcium
