Introduction to Preschool Early Intervention



Early Intervention (EI) assures that all eligible children from birth to five with developmental delays receive services and supports that maximize their development, so they are successful in any early education setting. Programs are provided to at-risk infants and toddlers or those with developmental delays, as well as to young children three and older who have disabilities and/or developmental delays.

Introduction to Preschool Early Intervention

- Early Intervention (EI) in PA refers to services & supports for eligible children birth through age 5, or *Age of Beginners*
- Overseen by the Office of Child Development & Early Learning (OCDEL) in Pennsylvania (PA)
- EI in PA is comprised of two systems:
 - Infant/Toddler – Birth through age 3 (Childlink & Partnership)
 - Preschool Early Intervention – Age 3 through *Age of Beginners* (Elwyn ELS)

Note: Preschool EI is provided through Elwyn Early Learning Services (ELS) in Philadelphia County, as well as the city of Chester in Delaware County, PA



Preschool Early Intervention Regulations

IDEA, Part B, Federal Regulations

- Provision of special education & related services for eligible children, ages 3-21

PA Title 22, Chapter 14, State Regulations

- Pennsylvania-state special education regulations, supports eligible children ages 3-21

Act 212 of 1990

- PA Early Intervention Services System Act

 - Gathering of information – demographic information, reason for referral, etc.
 - MDE evaluation will be scheduled
 - Paperwork will be reviewed & mailed to families
- For the evaluation to take place as scheduled, ELS **must** receive the signed parental consent form, referred to as the ***Permission to Evaluate (PTE)*** prior to the evaluation

Preschool Early Intervention Process

Intake/Initial Referral

Multi-Disciplinary Evaluation (MDE) to determine eligibility

If child is not eligible, connection to appropriate resources & other recommendations offered

If eligible, LEA Representative is assigned, and initial Individualized Education Program (IEP) is developed

Preschool EI Eligibility

Multi-Disciplinary Evaluation (MDE) occurs to thoroughly evaluate child & determine if they meet established eligibility criteria

Evaluation team will be comprised of numerous qualified early intervention personnel, as well as the family

Eligibility for Preschool EI in PA is determined using a “two pronged” criteria

Prong #1

Child demonstrates a 25 percent delay, or score of 1.5 SD below the mean on assessment tool, in one or more areas of development (Developmental Delay) **OR** child has a disability

Prong #2

Child shows a demonstrated need for Specially Designed Instruction (SDI), or Special Education & Related Services



Next Steps

Once the evaluation has been completed and the evaluation team has discussed and reviewed the evaluation results, the family will be notified regarding the eligibility determination

If the child is found eligible, a Local Education Agency (LEA) Representative will be assigned and an Individualized Education Program (IEP) will be developed during a meeting that will be scheduled with the IEP team, which includes the family

If child is not eligible, appropriate resources, supports & recommendations will be discussed

Elwyn provides both EI services and is a provider of Behavioral Health Services in Philadelphia

Elwyn Early Intervention Services

EI utilizes an educational evaluation to identify developmental delays and/or disabilities that impact a child's ability to succeed in the classroom

If child qualifies for Preschool EI, services may include (but are not limited to):

- Specialized Instruction (SI)
- Speech Therapy (SLP)
- Occupational Therapy (OT)
- Physical Therapy (PT)
- Services for Visually or Hearing Impaired

Elwyn Behavioral Health Services

As a CBH provider, Elwyn utilizes a behavioral evaluation for the purpose of identifying appropriate behavioral health services.

If a child qualifies for Behavioral Health Services, services may include (but are not limited to):

- Traditional Outpatient
- Individual IBHS
- Mobile Crisis (CMCT)
- Mobile Intervention (CMIS)
